## TO CANVASS CERTIFICATES FOR ELECTORS

State of Vermont, ss.

Pursuant to the laws of the State of Vermont, we, CHARLES H. STEARNS, Lieutenant-Governor, FREDERICK G. FLEETWOOD, Secretary of State, and JOHN H. MERRIFIELD, Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Board legally constituted by Section 170 of the Vermont Statutes to Canvass the votes for Electors of President and Vice President of the United States cast in the State of Vermont at the election held on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November, A.
